### **Graduate Professional Education**

Five (16.1%) of the respondents are currently enrolled in a degree program, three plan on getting a Master's degree, one a Doctorate and one a culinary certificate. Six (19.4%) of the respondents have completed a graduate degree, five received a Master's and one did not specify. Eleven (35.5%) plan on enrolling in a degree program in the future, and nine (29.0%) have no plans for further education. Of the respondents with graduate experience, five (45.5%) felt that Southeastern "Very Effectively" prepared them for further graduate/professional and five (45.5%) felt that Southeastern "Effectively" prepared them. Six (54.5%) indicated their program was "Very Related" to their Baccalaureate degree and four (36.4%) indicated it was "Somewhat Related".

### **Employment**

Twenty-six (83.9%) of the respondents are currently employed full-time, one (3.2%) is employed part-time and satisfied with part-time employment, two (6.5%) are employed part-time and looking for full-time employment, and one (3.2%) has a graduate assistantship. Of those who are employed full-time, twenty-two (84.6%) of the alumni are employed in the state of Louisiana and four (15.4%) are employed out of state. Two (7.7%) are employed in industry, twelve (46.2%) in business, one (3.8%) in higher education, one (3.8%) in a service organization, two (7.7%) in government, one (3.8%) in a professional firm, one (3.8%) in K-12 education, one (3.8%) in a nonprofit organization, two (7.7%) in a health agency, and two (7.7%) are self-employed. Eleven (42.3%) respondents indicated their education was "Very Effective" in preparing them for employment or improving their job performance, thirteen (50.0%) indicated it was "Effective", and two (7.7%) indicated it was "Ineffective". Twelve (46.2%) of the

respondents are employed in the area of their Southeastern bachelors degree, twelve (46.2%) in a related area, and two (7.7%) in an unrelated area. Three (11.5%) respondents indicated a salary range of \$20,000-\$30,000, two (7.7%) indicated \$30,001-\$40,000, four (15.4%) indicated \$40,001-\$50,000, six (23.1%) indicated \$50,001-\$60,000, four (15.4%) indicated \$60,001-\$70,000, one (23.1%) indicated \$70,001-\$80,000, and six (23.1%) greater than \$80,000.

### **Overall Satisfaction with Southeastern**

In general, respondents were satisfied with Southeastern. Fifty-five percent (54.8%, n=17) had a Very Positive general attitude toward Southeastern, and an additional 32.3% (n=10) had a Positive general attitude toward Southeastern. Three (9.7%) were Neutral towards Southeastern. When asked if they would recommend Southeastern to a friend or family member considering college, 61.3% (n=19) said they would with no reservations, ten (32.3%) would with some reservations, and one (3.2%) probably would not.

Twenty-seven (87.1%) of the respondents indicated that if they were to do it again, they would elect to attend Southeastern for their baccalaureate degree, two (6.5%) would not, and one (3.2%) was undecided. Respondents were also asked if their college education had improved the quality of their life, regardless of the financial benefits. Twenty-seven (87.1%) of the respondents indicated that the quality of their life had improved.

### Comments

This section contains the opinions of all alumni who volunteered narrative comments in response to an open-ended question. Positive and negative comments which have specifically named faculty or staff have not been deleted. These comments should not be considered representative, but should be evaluated within the context of the other results. The only editing of the comments is the deletion of expletives. For some programs, there were no alumni comments.

Not all comments are distributed with every report. The Provost's report contains all comments for all programs in all colleges. The reports distributed to Deans contain only the comments for the departments which report to each Dean. Finally, each department is provided with the comments made only by their students in each program within the department. Any other distribution will not contain the comments.
