Graduate Professional Education

Three (18.8%) of the respondents have completed another degree, two a Master's and one a second baccalaureate. One is currently enrolled in a second baccalaureate degree program, six (37.5%) plan on enrolling in a program in the future, and six (37.5%) have no plans for further education. Of the respondents with further educational experience, four (75.0%) felt that Southeastern "Very Effectively" prepared them for further graduate/professional and one (25.0%) felt they were "Effectively" prepared. Of those in a degree program, one (25.0%) indicated their program was "Very Closely Related" to their Baccalaureate degree, two (50.0%) indicated it was "Somewhat Related", and one (25.0%) indicated it was "Not at all Related".

Employment

Fourteen (87.5%) of the respondents are currently employed full-time, one (6.3%) is unemployed, but seeking employment, and one (6.3%) is not employed and not looking for employment. Of those who are employed full-time, eleven (78.6%) of the alumni are employed in the state of Louisiana and three (21.4%) are employed out of state. Ten (71.4%) are employed in industry, two (14.3%) in business, one (7.1%) in government, and one (7.1%) in a health agency. Eight (57.1%) respondents indicated their education was "Very Effective" in preparing them for employment or improving their job performance and six (42.9%) indicated it was "Effective". Twelve (85.7%) of the respondents are employed in the area of their Southeastern bachelors degree and two (14.3%) in a related area. One (7.1%) respondent indicated a salary range of \$20,000-\$30,000, one (7.1%) indicated \$40,001-\$50,000, two (14.3%) indicated \$50,000-\$60,000, one (7.1%) indicated \$60,001-\$70,000, two (14.3%) indicated \$70,001-\$80,000, and seven (50.0%) greater than \$80,000.

Overall Satisfaction with Southeastern

In general, respondents were satisfied with Southeastern. Fifty percent (50.0%, n=8) had a Very Positive general attitude toward Southeastern, and an additional 18.8% (n=3) had a Positive general attitude toward Southeastern. Four (25.0%) were Neutral towards Southeastern. When asked if they would recommend Southeastern to a friend or family member considering college, 62.5% (n=10) said they would with no reservations and five (31.3%) would with some reservations.

Thirteen (81.3%) of the respondents indicated that if they were to do it again, they would elect to attend Southeastern for their baccalaureate degree and two (12.5%) would not. Respondents were also asked if their college education had improved the quality of their life, regardless of the financial benefits. Fifteen (93.8%) of the respondents indicated that the quality of their life had improved.
