2022 - 2023 Highlights

- » Honors courses were taught in many areas in 2022-23 including: Accounting, Art, Biology, Chemistry, Communication, English, French, History, Mathematics, Psychology, Science, SE 101, and Spanish. The average Honors course size was 18 students.
- » Fifty-seven students earned Sophomore Honors Distinction for completing 15 hours of Honors courses with no grade lower than a 'B' by the end of their fourth regular semester in 2022-23. Seven students earned Senior Honors Distinction for maintaining a 3.2+ GPA and completing nine hours of upper-level Honors courses including a special topics course and thesis-reading training.



- Nine seniors presented their theses and earned the Honors Diploma in 2022-23. The disciplines in which the theses were completed attest to the breadth of the Honors Program. Students earned the Honors Diploma in Biology, Communication, English, History, Kinesiology, Mathematics, Psychology, and Sociology.
- Three Honors Living-Learning Communities (LLCs) were housed in Ascension Hall focused on Arts Appreciation, Leadership and Citizenship Development, and Health Sciences. A robust array of academic, service, and social events were offered through the Honors Student Association including dinner and a show at the historic Columbia Theatre, a Field Day pair up with Lions Connected special needs students, and a day of service with Big Event. Students in the constitutional convention honors seminar traveled to Washington, D.C. to examine America's founding documents.
