

Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 7.3% from the Spring 2024 semester to the Spring 2025 semester. This reflects an increase of 18.5% in preparatory enrollment, 2.3% in undergraduate enrollment and a 4.5% increase in graduate enrollment.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 34.2% of total enrollment compared to 28.0% in Spring 2024.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of preparatory students is 4.3. The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.9 hours which is the same as Spring 2024. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.4 hours, which is a decrease from 7.5 in Spring 2024.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 20.2 in Spring 2024 to 20.4 in Spring 2025.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 4.4% from the Spring 2024 semester to the Spring 2025 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



With 3,404 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Spring 2024, East Baton Rouge Parish had the largest increase (95.2%) in Preparatory students, Livingston Parish had the largest increase (6.1%) in undergraduate enrollment, and Ascension had the largest increase in graduate students with an increase of 29.9%.
