Advanced Mathematics Placement Policies

Students admitted into Southeastern who have their official ACT scores entered into Southeastern's computer system are eligible for advanced math course placement and credit as indicated below:

1. A student whose math ACT subscore is 28 or above is eligible to enroll directly in MATH 1620, 1630, 1750, or 2410, depending upon their choice of major. Upon completion of MATH 1620, 1630, 1750, or 2410 with the grade of "C" or better in the first attempt, the student will receive the grade "P" in MATH 1610, with 3 credit hours.
2. A student whose math ACT subscore is 28 or above is eligible to enroll directly in MATH 2000. Upon completion of MATH 2000 with a grade of "C" or better in the first attempt, the student will receive the grade "P" in MATH 1750, with 5 credit hours.
3. A student who earns credit in MATH 1630, 2000, or 2410 via the AP, Cambridge International, or International Baccalaureate Calculus or Statistics exams will receive the grade of "P" in MATH 1610, with 3 credit hours.
4. Students who transfer in a mathematics course at the level of trigonometry-based calculus or above with a grade of "C" or better will receive a grade of "P" for Math 1610, with 3 credit hours.
