

The Louisiana Children's Health Insurance Program (LaCHIP) is designed to bring quality health care to uninsured children and youth up to the age of 19 in Louisiana. Children can qualify for coverage under LaCHIP using higher income standards than Medicaid. For example, a family of four can now earn about \$37,700 a year and get health insurance for their children with no enrollment fees, no premiums, no copayments and no deductibles.



The **Medicare Savings Programs** (MSP) helps low income seniors and people with disabilities who don't qualify for full Medicaid benefits pay their Medicare premiums and co-payments. Those who qualify can receive \$799 a year to help pay their Medicare premiums. Nearly 250,000 people in Louisiana are eligible to receive help through **MSP**, but only half actually participate. A couple with limited financial resources earning \$16,900 a year or less would be eligible for premium assistance through MSP.



The **LaMOMS** program provides health coverage for prenatal and delivery services for pregnant women. By implementing income guidelines that match those put in place for LaCHIP the **LaMOMS** program makes proper prenatal care available to more pregnant women. A *family of three, including the couple and their unborn child can earn around* \$31,000 a year and still qualify for services.



The **Medicaid Purchase Plan** (MPP) is a new program that helps citizens with severe disabilities work and keep or get Medicaid health care benefits. Individuals can call 1-888-544-7996 to receive more information or an application for the program. *Individuals who have a monthly countable income of less than* \$1,871 and meet the above criteria are eligible for this program. Those who have a monthly countable income that exceeds \$1,123 must be willing to pay a small premium.
