



Graduating Class Profile Academic Year 2009-2010

Executive Summary

Each summer, the Office of Institutional Research and Assessment prepares the Graduating Class Profile Report. This year's report contains information on the 2009-2010 academic year graduates. Basic demographics are included as well as information on how long the graduates have attended Southeastern and from which institutions students transferred.

During the 2009-2010 academic year, Southeastern conferred a total of 2,369 degrees, an increase of 68 (3%) degrees from the 2008-2009 academic year. Eighty-one percent (81%) of baccalaureate degree recipients were White, Non-Hispanic, while sixty-five percent (65%) were female.

Some highlights from the tables include:

- Twenty-three percent (23%) of the graduates who started as beginning freshmen graduated within four years, which is four percentage points more than the 2008-2009 graduating class. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the transfers attended for four years, while twenty-two percent (22%) attended for three years.
- The most frequently occurring number of years at Southeastern was five for beginning freshmen and four for transfer students.
- Southeastern's leading feeder school was Louisiana State University – Baton Rouge, followed by Baton Rouge Community College, Delgado, University of New Orleans, River Parishes Community College, University of Louisiana-Lafayette, and Northwestern State University. This is the same set of schools as last year. The only change is that River Parishes Community College moved higher on the list.
- The undergraduate program with the highest number of graduates in 2009-2010 was the B.G.S. in General Studies. This program was followed by the B.A. in Management, B.S. in Nursing, B.B.A. in Business Administration, and B.A. in Marketing. This is identical to last year.
- The baccalaureate programs (at least 5 graduates) with the highest percentage of students who began as transfers were Health and Physical Education, followed by General Studies, Nursing, and English. In contrast, the programs with the lowest percentage of transfers were Early Childhood Education, Family and Consumer Sciences, Criminal Justice, Communication Sciences and Disorders, and History.
- Sixty-three percent (63%) of the baccalaureate degree recipients started at Southeastern as beginning freshmen.
