

Continuing Education

The Division of Continuing Education and Special Activities' main functions are the coordination of all non-credit and special activities, both on and off-campus, and the coordination of off-campus credit courses and telecourses. Continuing Education strives to meet the needs of the non-traditional student as well as the needs of business, industry, government, and the public sector. The division offers a variety of camps during the summer, and is also responsible for reserving Southeastern's facilities to off-campus groups.

Accomplishments of Continuing Education during the 2003-2004 academic year include:

- 5,968 students enrolled in academic courses at fifteen off-campus sites
- 10,016 students enrolled in electronically delivered courses
- 594 students enrolled in non-credit courses resulting in 55.6 CEU's awarded
- 3,805 students participated in Summer Camp Programs
- 30 off-campus groups reserved Southeastern's facilities, attracting over 20,000 visitors to the campus
- 160,230 individuals attended events at the University Center (not including Continuing Education classes and academic classes)
- 357 workers attended Incumbent Worker Training Program
