- » At the Fall 2006 Honors Program Awards Convocation, twenty-seven students received the Sophomore Honors Distinction Award. All of these students had a GPA of 3.5 or higher after completing at least sixty hours including at least twelve hours in Honors courses. Craig Saucier, of the Department of History and Political Science, received the annual Honors Teaching Award.
- » Honors students participated in the Louisiana Collegiate Honors Council annual meeting in New Orleans. Jenna Holmes presented her paper, “Dreams” a comparison of the use of dreams in Shakespeare’s *A Midsummer Night’s Dream* and Chekov’s *The Cherry Orchard*.
- » Haley Echlin received the Outstanding Honors Student Award from Phi Kappa Phi.
- » Twelve senior theses were presented in public forums. The disciplines in which the theses were completed represent the breadth of the Honors Program:

Music, Psychology, Biology, Political Science, and Education.

- » The Honors Student Team defeated all comers to win the Phi Kappa Phi Quiz Bowl during football Homecoming Week.
- » Nineteen students traveled to the National D-Day Museum in New Orleans to attend a special exhibit on the life and writing of Anne Frank.
