Athletics at Southeastern Louisiana University Notable Highlights 2012 - 2013

- » Southeastern senior defensive back Robert Alford was the 60th overall pick in the NFL Draft by the Atlanta Falcons. Alford, a native of Hammond, was the first draft pick for Southeastern since the program returned in 2003.
- » The Southeastern men's golf team won the Southland Conference championship. Behind individual medalist Rhys West and SLC Freshman of the Year Eamon Bradley, the Lions made their fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA Regionals.
- » A year after finishing last in the Southland Standings, the Southeastern women's tennis team won the Southland Conference regular season championship. Head coach Jason Hayes was named the Southland Conference Coach of the Year for a league record-tying fourth time.
- » The Southeastern baseball team made its second straight trip to the Southland Conference championship game. The Lions finished with a 36-win season in a year that saw Jordan Hymel throw the program's first no-hitter in nearly 30 years.
- » The Southeastern softball team set a new single-season school record with 32 victories, advancing to the Southland Conference Tournament for the first time since 2008. Behind All-Southland performers Michelle Duhe, Kelsey Nichols, Katie Lacour, Megan Moore and Amber Sather, Southeastern eliminated top seed McNeese State from the league tournament.
- » Behind Louisiana Player of the Year Courtney Donald, the Southeastern volleyball team advanced to the Southland Conference Tournament for the first time since 2009.

- » Louisiana Player of the Year and Southland Conference career shutout leader Lacey Bockhaus led the Southeastern soccer team to a third-place finish in the Southland standings. Senior Maiya Cooper was named first team All-Southland Conference for the fourth straight season and became the first player in school history to have four seasons with 10 or more goals.
- » Under first-year head coach Ron Roberts, Southeastern posted a 5-2 record in Southland Conference play – its best-ever finish in the Southland standings. The Lions defeated all three in-state league foes with wins over Northwestern State, Nicholls State and McNeese State.
