

Student Awards 2018 - 2019

- » Southeastern's Professional Sales Team won the Rookie Award at the 2019 International Collegiate Sales Competition (ICSC) in Orlando, Florida. Southeastern's Professional Sales program has been named one of the top sales programs in the country for the past two years by the Sales Education Foundation. The winning team was made up of Southeastern students India Williams, Karlie McDonald, and Paxton Page.
- » Amanda Triay won a 2018 Silver Remi Award for her 10-minute documentary, "To Speak Again," at the 51st annual WorldFest International Film and Video Festival in Houston. She won the award in the "College Student" division of the "Film and Video" competition.
- » Students at the Southeastern Channel were honored with college division Student Production Awards given by the Emmy Awards' Suncoast Region of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. John Sartori won in the "Talent" category, while Justin Redman, Ben Delbert, and Jonathan Calhoun won for their production in the "Commercial" category. In addition, Dylan Domangue and Alexis Minor were awarded \$5,000 scholarships each, while senior Amanda Kitch won a \$4,500 stipend.
- » Tyler Sansone was awarded a national \$5,000 scholarship from the Board of Certified Safety Professionals.
- » At the Southeastern Journalism Conference, KSLU News ranked first for Best College Radio Station, Northshore News ranked first for Best College Video News Program, and The Southeastern Channel ranked first for Best College TV Station. Five Southeastern students received awards: Connor Ferrill, first for Best Radio Journalist; Tyler Rogers, first for Best Broadcast Advertising Staff Member; Parker Berthelot, second for Best Television Hard News Reporter; Andrew Scherer, third for Best Television Feature Reporter; and Jessica Bowen, seventh for Journalist of the Year.
- » For the Columbia Scholastic Press Association Gold Circle Awards, Riana Brasleman and Jonathan Rhodes, both former staff reporters for *The Lion's Roar*, were honored for their work in cartooning and sports photography respectively.
- » Southeastern students at the Southeastern Channel won nine awards, the most of any university in television and broadcast videography, at the 2018 Mark of Excellence Awards given by the Society of Professional Journalists at its Region 12 conference. Winners include Parker Berthelot, Amanda Kitch, Dylan Domangue, Andrew Scherer, Schuylar Ramsey and Freddie Rosario.
- » KSLU newscaster and on-air host Connor Ferrill won first place in the Radio Newscast category at the Louisiana-Mississippi Associated Press Broadcasters and Media Editors college contest. Ferrill also brought home second place in the Radio Reporter category and received Best of Show.
- » Jacob Summerville was awarded second place in the Feature Photo category at the LA-MS APME Career Day and College Awards held at the Two Mississippi Museums in Jackson.
- » Graham Guillory was placed third in the Young Artist division at the 2019 Mississippi Guitar Festival Guitar Competition at William Carey College in Hattiesburg.
- » At the South Louisiana Regional Sales Competition, Southeastern won the Overall Team Award for receiving the most points, thanks to Southeastern's Sales Team made up of India Williams who won the Individual Sales Competition, the highest honor, and Paxton Page who won second runner-up.
- » Southeastern's student newspaper, *The Lion's Roar*, recently received several awards from the Louisiana Press Association "Better Newspaper Contest" for 2019. *The Lion's Roar* Editor-in-Chief Annie Goodman took first place in the Best Feature Story category for her piece titled "Overcoming Addiction: four years sober." Reporter Nikisun Shrestha also received recognition for his photography.
