

Athletics at Southeastern Louisiana University Notable Highlights 2018 - 2019

- » Southeastern Athletics claimed the Southland Strong Community Service Award for the second time in the past three years, finishing the year with a league-record 7,460 community service hours as a department.
- » Southeastern Athletics finished the 2018-19 year with the highest cumulative grade point average in department history.
- » Southeastern senior pitcher Corey Gaconi was named Academic All-America, Southland Conference Student-Athlete of the Year, Southland Conference and Louisiana Pitcher of the Year. Gaconi finished the year with a 7-3 record and a 2.57 earned run average to go with a 3.92 GPA for a Lion baseball team that won 33 games.
- » Southeastern Softball set a new conference and school record and led the nation with 227 steals. Jacquelyn Ramon received the Golden Shoe Award with 63 stolen bases. The team and Ramon's individual totals were both the 10th-highest single-season totals in Division I history for a SLU squad that finished 34-23 overall.
- » Southeastern seniors Marlain Veal and Moses Greenwood were both named first team All-Southland Conference, as the defending Southland Conference champion. Southeastern's men's basketball team advanced to the league tournament semifinals.
- » Devin King advanced to the NCAA Championships for the sixth and final time in his Lion career, finishing 11th in the national indoor meet.
- » Juwan Petit-Frere became the 10th multi-time All-American in the history of the Lion football program.
- » Five Lady Lion tennis players earned All-Southland Conference honors.
- » Joris Etlin represented the Southeastern golf team on the All-Southland Conference and Southland All-Academic teams.
- » Southeastern placed third on the All-Conference soccer team, including Sofia Olsson, who earned All-Louisiana accolades.
