Transfer Analysis
2013 Cohort

Graduation rates are one of higher education's metrics for measuring success. It is highly defined and standardized so that comparisons can be made across institutions. The basic definition starts with the students who comprise the cohort which are students who are full-time, first-time, degree-seeking freshmen. These students are tracked to see how many graduate within a continuous six-year period. However, Southeastern graduates many more students who do not meet the strict definition of the cohort. Students who transferred into Southeastern, students who started in the spring semester or students who started their higher education career as a part-time student are not part of Southeastern's nor any other institution's graduation rate. Furthermore, those students who started in our cohort but did not graduate from Southeastern within six years still have the opportunity to graduate. These students could still be enrolled and take longer than six years to graduate or they might transfer to another institution to pursue a degree.

The purpose of this report is to look at the group of our students who met the 2013 cohort definition and did not graduate from Southeastern, but transferred to another institution of higher learning.

The transfer information comes from the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). The NSC reports on over 3,600 colleges and universities across the nation and 99% of all students in public and private U.S. institutions. The NSC is the most comprehensive site from which to obtain enrollment and graduation data. NSC will provide confirmation of enrollment of students and the names of the institutions where they are enrolled. Only when a student graduates will NSC provide degree and major information.

There were 2,365 students in the 2013 cohort. From the cohort, 933 students or 39.5% of the cohort graduated from Southeastern within six years (through Summer 2019). There are 109 students (4.6%) from the 2013 cohort who were still enrolled at Southeastern in Fall of 2019. The 820 confirmed transfers represent an additional 34.7% of the cohort.

The average GPA of students who transferred was 2.014. Within the group of transfers, there were 56 students (6.8%) who withdrew prior to the end of their first semester, and therefore transferred from Southeastern without receiving any college credit. Due to this, these students were not included in the GPA calculations.

Of those who transferred with hours earned, 201 students (26.3%) transferred with 1 to 15 cumulative hours earned, and 563 (73.7%) transferred with 16 or more cumulative hours earned.

III. Students who Graduated from Another Institution

We used NSC reports to determine which students received some type of award from another institution. That information is summarized below.

There were 227 students who graduated with an Associate or Bachelor degree from another institution. For these students, the average cumulative hours earned at Southeastern was 42.4, average cumulative GPA was 2.757, and the average ACT composite was 22.1. For the students that did not receive a degree or certificate the comparative numbers were 33.7, 1.877, and 21.2 respectively.
