



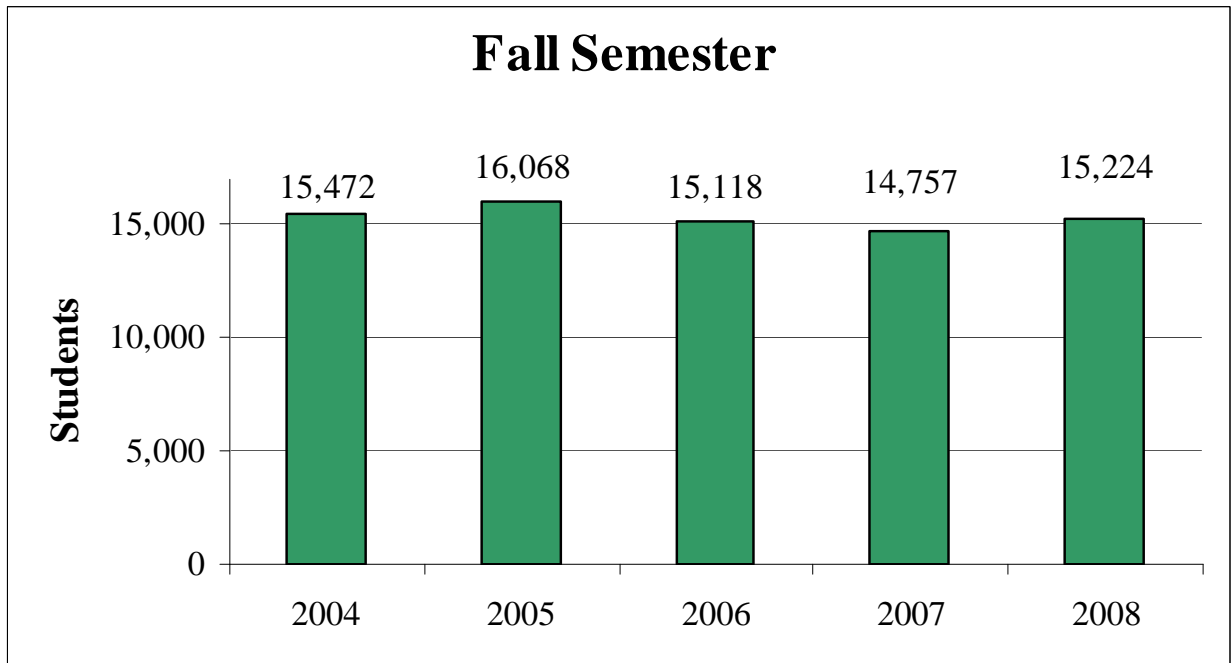
# *Semester Registration Report*

## *Fall 2008*

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### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 3.2% from the Fall 2007 semester to the Fall 2008 semester. This reflects a 4.7% increase in undergraduate enrollment and a 10.3% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased slightly to 20.6% of total enrollment compared to 20.7% in Fall 2007.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.0 hours which is a decrease from 13.5 in Fall 2007. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.5 hours, which is an increase from 6.1 in Fall 2007.

## Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 21.2 in Fall 2007 to 21.4 in Fall 2008.

## Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 0.6% from the Fall 2007 semester to the Fall 2008 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

## Top Six Parishes

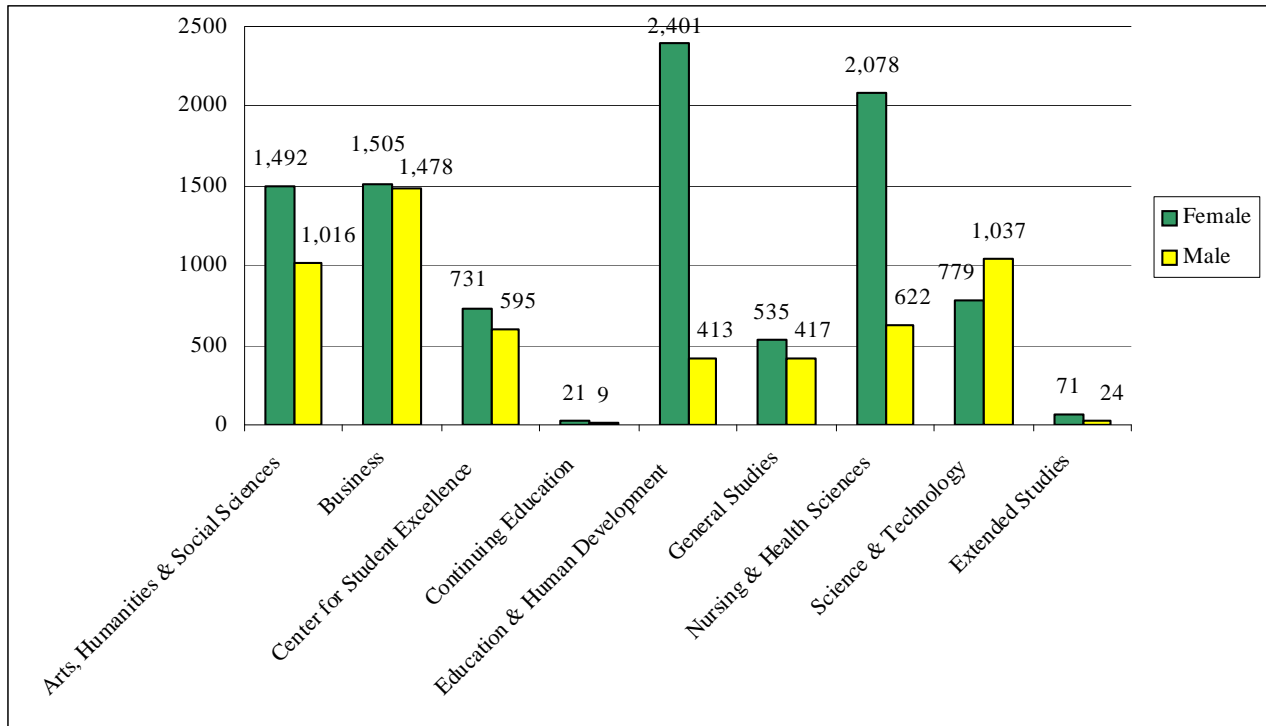

With 3,230 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Fall 2007, Livingston Parish had the largest increase (10.9%) in undergraduate enrollment. Ascension had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 4 students or 7.5%.
