

Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 2.9% from the Fall 2022 semester to the Fall 2023 semester. This reflects a 2.1% increase in undergraduate enrollment and a 13.3% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased to 28.9% of total enrollment compared to 29.7% in Fall 2022.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.2 hours which the same as Fall 2022. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.6 hours, which is an increase from 7.1 in Fall 2022.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score decreased to 22.5 as compared to 23.0 in Fall 2022.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 3.9% from the Fall 2022 semester to the Fall 2023 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes


