

Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 4.0% from the Fall 2023 semester to the Fall 2024 semester. This reflects a 3.9% increase in undergraduate enrollment and a 4.7% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased to 34.1% of total enrollment compared to 28.9% in Fall 2023.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of preparatory students is 3.7. The average undergraduate students is 13.7 hours which is an increase from 13.6 in Fall 2023. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.4 hours, which is a decrease from 7.6 in Fall 2023.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased to 22.6 as compared to 22.5 in Fall 2023.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 2.6% from the Fall 2023 semester to the Fall 2024 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



With 3,180 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Fall 2023, East Baton Rouge Parish had the largest increase (105.8%) in Preparatory students, Tangipahoa Parish had the largest increase (0.8%) in undergraduate enrollment, and St. Tammany Parish had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 8.8%.
