


Semester Registration Report Spring 2019

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 2.7% from the Spring 2018 semester to the Spring 2019 semester. This reflects a decrease of 2.7% in undergraduate enrollment and a 1.3% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased slightly to 31.1% of total enrollment compared to 31.2% in Spring 2018.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.4 hours which is an increase from 11.0 in Spring 2018. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.0 hours, which is the same as Spring 2018.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 21.5 in Spring 2018 to 21.9 in Spring 2019.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 0.1% from the Spring 2018 semester to the Spring 2019 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



Ascension had the largest increase in graduate students with an increase of 18.8%.
