Graduate Professional Education

Four (20.0%) of the respondents are currently enrolled in a doctoral program. Two (10.0%) have completed another Master's degree or a professional degree, but both plan on eventually obtaining a doctorate degree. Nine (45.0%) plan on enrolling in a doctoral degree program in the future and five (25.0%) have no plans for further education. Of the respondents with graduate experience, five (83.3%) felt that Southeastern "Very Effectively" prepared them for further graduate/professional study and one (16.7%) felt they were "Effectively" prepared. Of those who have earned a degree or enrolled in a program, five (83.3%) indicated the degree was "Very Closely Related" to their Master's degree and one (16.7%) indicated it was "Somewhat Related".

Employment

Nineteen (95.0%) of the respondents are currently employed in K-12 education in the state of Louisiana. The rest of them employment information is based on those who are employed full-time. Eleven (57.9%) respondents indicated their education was "Very Effective" in preparing them for employment or improving their job performance, five (26.3%) indicated it was "Effective", one (5.3%) indicated it was "Ineffective", and two (10.5%) indicated it was "Very Ineffective". Twelve (63.2%) of the respondents are employed in the area of their Southeastern master's degree, five (26.3%) in a related area, and two (10.5%) in an unrelated area. Seven (36.8%) respondent indicated a salary range of \$40,001-\$50,000, two (10.5%) indicated \$50,001-\$60,000, four (21.1%) indicated \$60,001-\$70,000, five (26.3%) indicated \$70,001-\$80,000, and one (5.3%) greater than \$80,000.

Overall Satisfaction with Southeastern

In general, respondents were satisfied with Southeastern. Seventy percent (70.0%, n=14) had a Very Positive general attitude toward Southeastern, and an additional 15.0% (n=3) had a Positive general attitude toward Southeastern. When asked if they would recommend Southeastern to a friend or family member considering graduate education, 80.0% (n=16) said they would with no reservations, 10.0% (n=2) indicated they would with some reservations, and 5.0% (n=1) indicated they would with strong reservations.

The majority (85.0%, n=17) of the respondents indicated that if they were to do it again, they would elect to attend Southeastern for their Master's degree. Respondents were also asked if their college education had improved the quality of their life, regardless of the financial benefits. The majority (80.0%, n=16) of the respondents indicated that the quality of their life had improved.
