





Lion Intervention Network

Southeastern is committed to our students' academic success and to providing a supportive environment that boasts an array of resources to help them achieve that success. Each student is a member of the Southeastern family, and the university wants to ensure that all are receiving any extra help they may need, especially those facing certain challenges or adversities. The Lion Intervention Network (LINK) is a new tool developed to help faculty and staff identify students who exhibit concerning behavior changes or those who are facing academic challenges and/or personal crises that are hindering their academic performance.

There are abundant resources available to students across campus. LINK can connect students with needed resources and empower them to take advantage of their benefits.

All LINK referrals will be evaluated and routed to appropriate campus departments based on the concerns reported. Individuals within their respective departments of expertise will then reach out to the referred student to offer assistance and provide any necessary follow-up.

With your help, students can receive assistance with resources such as academic advising, personal counseling services, workshops, and campus involvement.

LINK is designed to help with such concerns as:

- Class Attendance
- Disruptions in class
- Poor academic performance
- Abrupt changes in behavior or appearance
- Financial concerns
- Academic skills deficits (study skills, note-taking, etc.)
- Personal or emotional difficulties

LINK can help if students...

- Report they are homeless
- Report they are in need of food
- Report they are depressed, anxious or having issues with mood swings
- Exhibit a sudden change in behavior
- Report death of a family member or friend
- Report hospitalization
- Voice significant financial need
- Ask for help due to a disability, but do not provide an accommodation letter
- Tell you they have not received a note taker in class despite having requested one several times
- Are not progressing in a certain course and you have assisted all you can
- Stop attending class and do not respond to attempts to contact
- Do not seem to be managing time or organizing self at a college level
- Exhibit poor study or writing skills that are significantly hindering them
- Want to receive testing for a learning disability or other condition

These are but a few examples of situations in which LINK can help.
