Monthly Calls for Service - March 2024:

For the last calendar year, criminal activity on campus has continued to see a steady decline as calls for service have remained about the same. This means more people are reporting, which is a good thing. The more we are informed, the more proactive we can be in keeping campus safe.UPD had 1629 activities in January

- UPD took 88 reports, to include:
 - 6 auto accidents/crashes
 - 21 medical emergencies
 - 1 sexual assault
 - 5 thefts
 - 3 drug violations
 - 2 alcohol violations
 - 6 suspicious activity calls
- UPD completed 54traffic stops and issued 20 traffic citations

UPD keeps a Daily Crime and Fire Log available at the University Police Department. This report can be viewed upon-request during University business hours.
