As we move through the exciting activities of Homecoming Week 2024, let's not forget about the big game. On Saturday, October 19th, your Southeastern Lions will take on Stephen F. Austin in Strawberry Stadium with a 4 pm kickoff. We are now 2-0 in the Southland Conference, putting us in first place! How about them Lions?!

Prior to the Homecoming game is tailgating in Friendship Circle. I would like to remind everyone about some of the basic tailgating policies the University has in place to keep everyone safe and make it an enjoyable experience.

- No golf carts (only exception is persons on official University business) or vehicles inside Friendship Circle after 10 am. The parade rolls at 12

- No bottles. If you have glass, pour it in a cup.
  No music that is offensive, includes profane language, or is drowning out others in the area. Please be respectful of other attendees.
- All music must be turned off at 3:55 pm, which is just prior to kickoff.
- Electrical cords should not use building power.

UPD and our student patrol will be patrolling Friendship Circle to ensure everyone is safe and having a good time. Should you need anything, we are easy to spot in our bright highlighter shirts.

## Monthly Calls for Service - August 2024:

For the last calendar year criminal activity on campus has continued to see a steady decline as calls for service have remained about the same. This means more people are reporting, which is a good thing. The more we are informed, the more proactive we can be in keeping campus safe. Below are the campus statistics for the month of September 2024.

- UPD had 1505 activities in September.
- UPD took 105 reports:
  - 24 medical emergencies
  - 14 traffic crashes 5 hit and runs
  - 4 thefts
  - 3 simple burglaries
  - 2 alcohol violations
  - 1 drug violation
- UPD completed 126 traffic stops and issued 75 traffic citations.

UPD keeps a Daily Crime and Fire Log. This Log is available at the University Police Department during University business hours upon request. - . Pay attention to your surroundings.
- Make eye contact with people as they approach.

Also use the "Friend Walk", "Mobile Blue Light", and all the other resources provided to you for your safety. \*We are aware of a current connection issue for users to download the app from the Google store. We are actively working to get this corrected and back online as soon as possible.
